Steve Sloat, Professional Race Car Driver and Rtd. U.S. Marshal

Chase and Race (a Checkered Past)

Synopsis: Steve Sloat, a native Texan, began his career as a narcotics investigator then becoming a Deputy U.S. Marshal. After 15 years of chasing the bad guys and getting shot at, he decided to turn in his badge and gun for a helmet and driving suit. In an arena where driving fast was applauded, without bullets being involved, he completed the two requisite race driving school courses and received a novice Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) racing license. Three months later, he received his SCCA National racing license. Setting the standard high, the majority of Steve's racing career was spent in the highly competitive Spec Racer class. By 1994, he had won the SCCA National Race Championship for the Southwest Division and continues to hold the Spec Racer speed record at Texas World Speedway. He continues to teach car racing for Ferrari, Porsche and other car clubs.
